

How To Load a Roll Off Dumpster The Right Way

1. Pre-Planning Your Dumpster Load

Proper planning ensures safety, maximizes space, and prevents additional fees.

Key Steps:

- Confirm allowed materials before loading
- Separate debris into categories:
 - Heavy materials (concrete, roofing, dirt)
 - Bulky items (furniture, cabinets)
 - Light debris (trash, boxes)
- Estimate volume and weight
- Stage debris near the dumpster
- Break down large items



2. Prepare the Drop-Off Area

A properly prepared area improves safety and efficiency.

Best Practices:

- Use a flat, solid surface
- Ensure rear door access is clear
- Allow 20 to 30 feet of space
- Avoid overhead obstructions
- Use wood boards if needed

3. Create a Load Plan Before You Start

Do not randomly load debris.

Plan Your Load:

- Place heavy materials first
 - Position bulky items to reduce empty space
 - Keep weight evenly distributed
 - Avoid stacking in one area

4. Load Heavy Materials First

This is critical for balance and safety.

Guidelines:

- Place heavy debris on the bottom
 - Distribute weight evenly
 - Avoid one-sided loading
 - Keep weight centered

5. Load Bulky Items Strategically

Best Practices:

- Place flat items along walls
 - Stand items upright when possible
 - Fill gaps with smaller debris
 - Avoid empty space pockets

6. Fill in With Smaller Debris

Tips:

- Fill all gaps
 - Spread evenly across container
 - Avoid piling in one area
 - Level as you go
-

7. Maintain an Even Load

Important Rules:

- Keep debris level
 - Avoid front or rear heavy loads
 - Balance side to side
 - Check distribution often
-

8. Never Load Above the Fill Line

Why It Matters:

- Unsafe for transport
- Risk of debris falling out
- Pickup may be refused
- Additional fees will apply

Rule:

- All debris must remain below the top edge
 - Nothing can stick above the container
-

9. Avoid Prohibited Materials

Examples:

- Hazardous waste
- Liquids
- Flammable materials
- Restricted items

Always verify before loading.

10. Final Check Before Pickup

- Load is level and evenly distributed
 - Nothing exceeds the fill line
 - No prohibited items included
 - Rear door is secure and closed properly
